## Invitation Run To Mudgee October 2008

Eight cars dating from the 20's to modern departed with 15 people on board for our destination of Mudgee in NSW. Our first overnight stop was the tidy town of Glen Innes. Heather and I settled into the Clansman Motel while the others chose a more central location. Nola and John Wilson of Glen Innes (Wolseley Club Members) came to meet us and invited us all to dine with them at the local Club. A great evening. Monday morning Nola and John gave us a guided tour of the town showing us the Celtic Stones and historic buildings and areas. Unfortunately a lot of buildings are empty with the closure of the rail and people moving to a warmer climate. It would be a nice place to live if you like winter mornings down to -16°.

At Guyra we visited the tomato exchange. This was interesting I thought so here is some facts of growing truss tomatoes in a glass house. The Glasshouse Contains; 100,800 square meters (10.08ha) of growing area (4 AFL football fields) 1,400 tonnes of steel. 1,400 tonnes of glass. 220 Km of heating pipe containing 500,000 litres of water for heating. 124 Km of irrigation hose. 62 Km of hanging gutters. 8 Km of underground piping. 300,000 plants. 256 Km of crop wire. 2960 steel posts. Approximately 72,000 panes of strengthened glass and supports 1,350 tonnes of weight in plants, add another 650 tonnes in hanging gutters and growing medium totaling 2,000 tonnes of weight excluding rainwater and snow. Produces more than 36 million tomatoes, side by side these fruit could line the road from Brisbane to Alice Springs (halfway across the country!) 10 mm of rain on the 10 hectare glasshouse will result in a run off of 1 million litres (1meg) of water. Each plant produces 20kg of tomatoes in one year. Has to be pollinated 3 times a week. Grows 30 cm in one week. Holds 35-40 at any time after picking. Has to be picked twice a week. Has to have three leaves removed every week. Has to be lowered 30 cm every week. Grows one truss per week. Is grown in a natural recyclable growing medium. Is grown with mountain spring water. Each tomato grows 1mm in size every 24 hours. Takes 50-60 days to ripen. Has used 90% less water to grow than a field tomato. Has used 80% less fertilizer to grow compared to a field tomato. Guyra has the best

combination of cool summers and high winter light to produce the best tasting tomatoes. Is at 1,330 metres altitude. This farm has just build another glass house along side the other so when you buy truss tomatoes they most likely come from Guyra NSW.

Somewhere in this area Greg in the second Alvis blew a head gasket which was bad luck. However after ten minutes of wondering how he was going to resolve the problem a four wheel drive with a car trailer attached pulled in and said he was going to Brisbane. \$150.00 for fuel and he was back home with the Alvis. Greg later returned with a Jaguar SS.

Now on to Tamworth. After a cup of coffee we explored the town and checked the dinner venue which was some distance from the motel. Heather spotted the Spotlight Store with a 20% sale. We now had a boot load of stuff. Two taxis took us to and from the McGuire's dinner venue. Tuesday morning we took off at 8.00am as I wanted to go to Wellington out near Dubbo to check the town out for a future Rally for another car club. We travelled by Gunnedah, Mullaley, Tambar Springs. It was there somewhere we went through a lot of water and a minute or so later the engine stopped. I checked the distributor but it was dry so had to scratch the grey matter. The fuel pump is underneath the car and the force of the water pulled the wires off the fuel pump. A pit stop at Coolah and a bite to eat at Dunedoo. Wellington it just belted down with rain but we were able to do what we wanted. From there it was over to Mudgee 80 ks away. We were the first of the nine to book into the Motel. The six from the Bayside Club had already arrived at the Caravan Park. Dinner was at a local pub when we found one that was not too busy and after walking back to the Motel we were escorted by a lady into a dark park. We did not know what to expect but there it was , a telescope. We spent the next fifteen minutes or so looking at the moon and stars.

Wednesday morning Chris chartered a Toyota Coaster for a tour of Gulgong, a town time has left behind. It would be easy to imagine a horse drawn stage coach travelling up the street, the historic buildings are all very old, the main street has bends in it. Fascinating little and big shops, an Opera House and a large Museum in a maze of buildings. Three hours of walking which went very quick, we boarded the Coaster for the second part of the run to our first winery. Some samples were tasted and bottles purchased. That evening dinner was at

the golf club, it took a while to receive our meals but when they arrived they were well worth it.

Thursday 9.00am we are on our way to Lue. Chris said to spend 15 minutes at the pottery. He was wrong ,we spent 2 hours on a guided tour exploring every aspect of making pots, plates and bowls. The gentleman's inventive, creative and quick wit made it very entertaining for all. Lunch was at Rylstone. Again it took a long time to be served but again it was well worth waiting for. From here the other cars did the circuit back to Mudgee but Heather and I also Gaye and Derek, travelling with us, travelled back the way we had come so we could visit a cheese and wine establishment. All I purchased was a block of cheese. The wine in this district is too dry for the both of us so we left it on the shelf. Dinner was at the Court House Hotel alongside our Motel. This was the final night together so we made the most of it Another great meal was had by all.
